A small number of Album 1 with pages 3-6 only are still available, containing 33 earlier coins. These will be supplied strictly on a first-come, first-served basis.

### FAO Money Panels

These contain a representative selection of FAO Money, for display in home or office, chosen from the coins of the complete Album edition. Like the Albums, they are limited to an edition of 10,000 worldwide. Currently or offer is Money Panels 1 and 2, which present a collection of 35 coins from Album I, in leatherette finish with silver-stamped captions. Panel I is in scarlet and contains 19 low and medium value current coins; Panel 2, finished in midnight blue, contains 16 high-value commemoratives. The coins are mostly uncirculated (the others are prooflike or proof), and are protected by transparent sliding windows. The catalogue value of the coins, as listed in the 5 June 1973 FAO Teleguotes, was \$78.30.

Panels 1 and 2 are sold as a set at \$68 per set, in English, French, German or Italian texts, as desired. A third Panel, presenting selected coins from the first pages of Album 2, is in preparation.

Orders for FAO Money Albums and Money Panels can be sent to the FAO Washington Office for swift forwarding to Rome. Dispatch will be made from Rome, via Washington, within ten days of receipt of order. Payment may be made by US dollar cheque or money order payable to FAO Money Office; the listed US \$ prices, inclusive of handling, packing and dispatch by insured mail, are valid to 31 December, 1973. After that date FAO reserves the right to alter prices without notice. A limited installment plan is available for collectors who wish to pay for the complete Album.

# FAO Money . . .

By the end of 1973 some 90 FAO-inspired coins will have been released in over 50 countries all with designs and legends which spell out the greatest challenge of our time: the need to provide FOOD-EDUCATION-EMPLOYMENT FOR ALL. This first-ever international coin issue on a common theme is sponsored by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations. Rome. The low-value FAO coins serve as tiny but insistent reminders, in daily circulation, of the urgent need to grow more food; the larger commemoratives generate seignorate funds for agricultural development.

This programme is followed by a growing community of collectors throughout the world who share FAO's ideals and who, through their purchase of FAO money collections, lend their mora and financial support to this longterm programme.
