## FAO MONEY AND MEDALS: Newsletter 28

Dear Friend,

- 1. Pages 4-6 of the 1979/80 FAO Money Collection (illustrated overleaf) have now been despatched, and we would urge collectors who have not yet ordered their sets to do so without delay since stocks are very limited.
- A new binder and three pages will be ready in early December, containing the following coins:

You will see that these three pages contain four silver coins and one gold, which means that while the issue price is rather higher than usual collectors are getting good value for money. You may, however, pay in two instalments if you prefer, with your album being sent on receipt of the second instalment.

- 3. At the Twentieth session of the FAO Conference in November 1979, a resolution was unanimously passed which declared that a World Food Day would be observed every year on 16 October, the anniversary of the founding of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations. One means by which nations may mark the first World Food Day on 16 October 1981 will be by the issue of special coins, both circulating and commemorative.
- 4. Hungary, one country which sponsored the World Food Day resolution, was the first to announce its participation with a 100 forint coin. Other countries which have already indicated their interest in striking for World Food Day include Cameroon, Czechoslovakia, Haiti, Isle of Man, Poland, San Marino and the Sovereign Order of Malta. 1981 will be numismatically a most exciting year for FAO coin collectors.
- 5. In para 2 you will have seen that the new album will contain 5 and 600 baht coins from Thailand, These coins, illustrated below, were issued on 12 August 1980 on the occasion of Queen Sirikit's birthday, and are of particular interest to collectors of both FAO coins and medals since the portrait of the Queen on the obverse is that used for the Ceres medal in her honour released in March 1979 and featured in Newsletter 25 of 29 June. Also illustrated below are stamps issued by Thailand featuring the Queen Sirikit medal,





- 6. The latest FAO Ceres medal, illustrated overleaf, commemorates the 35th anniversary of FAO. The obverse reproduces a Roman Denarius issued by the moneyer L. Furius Cn. f. Brocchus in the year 63 B.C. depicting the Roman goddess Ceres and an ear of wheat, while the reverse shows the FAO building and emblem in the foreground with the principal Roman monuments in the background. Designed by Sergio Giandomenico, the leading Italian artist responsible for the recent Italian 100 and 200 lire FAO coins, the medal was struck at the Picchiani & Barlacchi Mint in Florence in 50 mm bronze and silver (50 grs) 28 mm silver (17 grs) and 28 mm 18 ct gold, and may be ordered by means of the form on page 4.
- 7. Collectors will note that the 50 mm silver medal contains more silver than any other struck this year in this diameter: nonetheless we are holding to the same price as that asked for the lighter medals. In Newsletter 27 we guaranteed to hold medal prices until 31 May, and we have in fact held them up to the present in spite of the rising price of gold. Unfortunately, as from 1 November we have had to increase prices for gold medals to \$360. These prices are now guaranteed until 31 December 1980,

8. Clive Stannard has taken over as Chief of the FAO Money and Medals Programme with effect from 1 August. Mr. Stannard, a longtime collector of ancient Greek and Roman coins and a Fellow of the Royal Numismatic Society, has been working for FAO for the last four years, dealing particularly with the development problems of the countries of East and Southern Africa.




