Dear Friend.

On 16 October 1972, in Collector Note 3, we invited you to send us a personalized designation to inscribe on a numbered frontispiece for your FAO Money Album I.

Most collectors replied to this Note and others who did not reply directly were sent the frontispiece when they purchased Album I page 6 or Album 2.

Unfortunately the records we received from our distributor in the case of your purchase were not maintained on a page-by-page basis, nor do we know how many Albums I you bought. Rather than leave you with an unpersonalized Album therefore we now enclose your named and numbered frontispiece.

The frontispiece mentions 33 countries and so is applicable to Albums I which

(1) go only as far as 5 pages

(2) include either page 6 or 6a, with the uncirculated or proof Caribbean crowns, or

(3) include both page 6 and page 6a

This is because the same Currency Authority which issued the Barbados coin in page 5 also issued the seven other East Caribbean crowns on page 6 and page 6a, and is considered as only one country in Yeoman's Current Coins of the World.

If the enclosed frontispiece does not bear your correct or complete designation, please return it altered as you would like to receive it. If you have bought two or more FAO Albums I, please let us know this by means of the attached form, and we will send you more frontispieces. If you decided not to go beyond Album I page 4 (or 2 or 3), you may find the frontispiece inaccurate, so we would appreciate your returning it. If you would also like us to buy back your incomplete Album I, you can inform us by replying to Collector Note 5 (point 3) of 13 March 1973.

Finally, the attached form also allows payment in instalments for Money Albums 2 (and, if desired, Money Album I page 6), to allow collectors to continue their FAO Money collections in easy stages; in this way the heavy initial investment in Money Album 2 can be spread over four or five payments. These items can, of course, be paid outright, as can any Album I pages missing from your collection, using the payment form enclosed with Collector Note 8 of 16 October 1973.

These coins are illustrated on the first page of Collector Note 4 of 15 December. It is expected that despatch will begin May/June.

More details of the coins, such as the tabulation enclosed with Album 2 pages 1 and 2, will be distributed with page 4, which we expect to release in September/October 1973, with many of the following coins:

Pre-devaluation prices for FAO Money items maintained till 30 April

- The last page of this Note lists the new US \$, Italian Lire and UK b prices valid from now on for all FAO Money. The French franc prices remain the same, and prices are now given for the first time in Swiss francs, German marks, Dutch guilders, and Danish kroner. However, as a gesture of goodwill to collectors who paid in US \$, Lire or UK b, we will maintain for orders sent by 30 April 1973 prices in these currencies given for FAO Money items 1-11 listed in Collector Note 4.
- Our offer extends also to collectors who paid only the initial instalment for Album 2, namely the \$57, 33,500 lire or £24.50 listed under item 2 of Collector Note 4. These collectors can still obtain with payments made before 30 April 1973 a complete FAO album at the pre-devaluation price of only \$100 (58,000 lire or UK £42.50). Such collectors would thus pay \$43 (24,500 lire or £18) to complete their album payments, rather than the \$53 (28,500 lire or 622.40) payment effective after 30 April. Thereafter the FAO Coin Office will no longer newly offer Album 2 by instalment, given the approaching despatch of page 3 and planned manufacture of page 4.

Option on Album 2

5. The large initial outlay for Album 2 may have discouraged some purchasers from continuing with the Food for All money collections. However, on payment of a non-refundable deposit of \$20 (or equivalent) we will keep open for them an option on one or more of the 10,000 complete Albums 2 at \$110, an option which must be exercized by 30 September 1973, provided they indicate this on the attached form. It would similarly be appreciated if persons not wanting Album 2 would so inform FAO, because there are many other persons eager to possess one of the 10,000 FAO complete collections which the Albums represent, especially in North America, an area where there has been virtually no advertising since late 1969, when the FAO Coin Office concentrated its sales efforts elsewhere.

Album 1: Page 6a

- 6. As another gesture of goodwill, FAO will assume responsibility for satisfying collectors who, perhaps for lack of an alternative, purchased the proof Caribbean page 6a. Now that page 6, with the uncirculated coins, is once again available in sufficient quantities, persons wishing to sell page 6a should inform FAO. We will then advise them where to despatch the page, either to Rome via our Washington Office or direct to a would-be purchaser. We will then credit the seller with \$58 for other FAO purchases, thus absorbing as our loss the distributor's profit. Persons wishing to buy a proof page 6a should also inform FAO and, as soon as there are pages 6a available, FAO will call in their \$58 payment. The binder and extending screws for Album I are designed to take seven pages, so Album I can accommodate both page 6 and page 6a.
- 7. It so happens that the present demand for page 6a is greater than the supply: if FAO's offer should increase the supply, we shall offer page 6a for sale outside North America, something which we have not yet done, because our policy was to limit sales of page 6a to North American collectors, who suffered most from the delay in obtaining the uncirculated page 6. However, our offer to act as an unpaid middleman is valid only for orders posted by 36 April 1973, after which we must assume that all collectors are satisfied with their purchases.

Repurchase of Album 1: pages 1-3

- 8. Also as a gesture of goodwill, we will buy back from collectors at the prices paid for them all initial 2 or 3 page Albums I (the Uganda, Vatican and Guyana pages) where persons do not wish to continue with the collection. From our experience this happens mainly where persons gave the initial pages away as presents. We are therefore requesting such persons to send us the names of the recipients, so that FAO may enquire whether they would like to buy the rest of Album 1, sell it back to FAO, or exchange it for other FAO numismatic items whose market value is not diminished by incompleteness. Conversely, persons wishing to add their names to FAO's waiting-list for the initial pages of Album 1, should so inform FAO.
- 9. In any case Collector Note 4 provides the last opportunity to buy page 3 of Album I singly, because after 30 April only pages 4, 5 and 6 will be available singly, page 3 being sold only in a 'short' Album 1, together with the pages 4, 5 and 6.

FAO Money Panels

- 10. We are pleased to announce French, German and Italian editions of FAO Money Panels 1 and 2, as part of the worldwide edition of 10,000 collections. Also, in late 1973, we expect to issue FAO Money Panel 3, with some 19 to 23 coins from Album 2. The panels are in different colours for all four languages, a red-based colour for Panel 1, blue for Panel 2, and green/brown for Panel 3.
- ll. The panel sets contain most but not all of the coins in the Albums, but no coin which is not in an Album. The Money Panels therefore are not recommended to persons who wish to have only one FAO collection, a complete one. On the other hand, they make very much more

attractive display items, for hanging on home or office walls, symbols of pardonable pride at support for our joint Food for All objectives.

FAO Medals

- 12. The third Ceres medal, with Olave Lady Baden-Powell representing the Roman goddess of agriculture, is now being prepared by David Wynne, who has already sculpted the official portrait of the World Chief Guide, and was recently responsible for the clasped hands reverse of the new 50 pence coin commemorating Britain's entry into the institutions of the European Economic Community. In order to keep down prices in future, new Ceres medals usually will be struck in smaller, 63 mm size.
- 13. Meanwhile the prices of the larger 68 and 72 mm FAO medals have had to be raised, on the one hand because we have had to re-order at the new French franc rates, and on the other because the Paris Mint is increasing its prices by some 20-25%, the first rise since August 1969. However, we will maintain till 30 April 1973 the prices given on the last page of Collector Note 4 for items 12 and 13, the bronze and silver Indira Gandhi/World Forestry Congress medals.
- 14. Also, with the price of gold going up some 30% in February, we have had to raise the prices immediately of all gold medals. The new prices are given in items 11 and 16 on the last page, and these prices will be maintained as long as the price does not rise 20% more than its 1 March level. Meanwhile, as a more economic item, we are putting on sale gold-dipped versions of the 68 mm and 72 mm bronze medals, with stands to match.

* * * * * * *

15. In conclusion may we thank you again for your support of our Food for All objectives through your purchase of FAO money and medals. You are taking part in the first international coin issue in monetary history and, with the number of FAO coins now approaching 600 million, you have helped us create a 'march of dimes' from Rome to Los Angeles or from Rome to Phnom-Penh. With your continued support, we would hope in a few years to encircle the globe, linking up all three places in a symbolic, but indestructible line of 'Freedom from Want'.

Personalized Frontispiece for FAO Album I

From the beginning the FAO Coin Office planned to number individually each of the 10,000 issues of FAO Money Album I. We thought first of numbering the individual pages, but found this impracticable because of the complications of ensuring that each of 10,000 persons received the same page all the way through. We have therefore prepared a numbered and named frontispiece, as overleaf. The frontispiece exists in five languages: Danish, English, French, German and Italian, and the numbers of course run from 1 to 10,000, with the last 250 used for presentations to heads of state and other national and international leaders.

- 2. The number of countries reads as 33, because all eight Caribbean coins were issued by the single East Caribbean Currency Authority. The frontispiece therefore is applicable also to a five-page album, in deference to the several clients who, having bought page 5 with the Barbados coin, considered page 6 with the other seven ECCA crowns as somewhat expensive.
- 3.
